





MATHEWS FROM LLANDAFF TO IRELAND TO GEORGIA TO SELMA AND MATHEWS, ALABAMA

A branch of our family, which has the same lineage we have from Sr. David to Governor Samuel Mathews of Virginia to Mary and Isaac Mathews Sr., moved from Virginia to South Carolina in 1767/68, eventually settling in the Edgefield area on the Georgia line. The author of the 1909 history, Dr. James Christopher Mathews, was of that branch. Although his family had moved to the west central part of Georgia by the mid 1800s. We are descendants of Isaac Jr.

At roughly the same time, a group of Mathews settled in the broad River area of Georgia, not too far from Edgefield, South Carolina, where Isaac's family settled. These Mathews are descendants of Gov. George Mathews, a Revolutionary war general from Virginia, whose descendants settled Selma and the town of Mathews (a community in Montgomery County).

We should find out the connection between George Mathews group and the Isaac Mathews group. General George (1739-1812) commanded the 9th Virginia Regiment at Brandwine and Germantown, where he was wounded and captured. Then he moved to Georgia, becoming Governor for the first time in 1787.

Governor George, famous or infamous, depending on your point of view, for his role in granting "unallocated" lands to settlers under the Yazoo Act, was the son of John Mathews of Augusta County, Virginia, who emigrated from Ireland in 1737. (See *The Public Life of George Mathews in Georgia*, a masters thesis by Robert Bruce Cannady written in 1957 at the University of Georgia.)

I believe John Mathews was most likely a descendant of the George Mathews who settled in Tipperary County, Ireland in the seventeenth century. He is described in Chapters Seven and Eight of the Boots genealogy.

The son of the Governor, George Jr., moved to Louisiana and had a distinguished career as a jurist. In 1819, a grandson, also George, was one of the founders of Selma, most of whom came from the Broad River area. (See *Selma* by Alston Fitts III.) He was later a planter in the Montgomery area.

Another Mathews from the Broad River (Oglethorpe County), and likely a member of this same family, Dr. Frank Menweather Mathews IV, founded the town of Mathews just outside of Montgomery in 1819.
